Phonics at Scott Primary



- In school, we follow the Letters and Sounds programme. Letters and Sounds is a phonics resource published by the Department for Education and Skills which consists of six phases.
- We also use the actions and rhymes from Jolly Phonics.
- Phonics is taught everyday at 8.55am for 20 mins
- After children have passed their Phonic screening assessment then children go on to SPAG – Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

Terminology



- Phoneme – the sound a letter makes
-
- Grapheme – how a sound is written
-
- Segmenting and blending – segmenting for reading, blending for reading
-
- Digraph – two letters that make one sound – ch, th, oa
-
- Trigraph – three letters that make one sound – tch, igh
-
- Split digraph – a digraph that has a letter splitting it – a-e, i-e
-
- Abbreviations – cvc (dog), ccvc (slam), cvcc (band)



Phase 1

Phase One of 'Letters and Sounds' concentrates on developing children's speaking and listening skills and lays the foundations for the phonic work which starts in Phase 2. The emphasis during Phase 1 is to get children attuned to the sounds around them and ready to begin developing oral blending and segmenting skills.

Phase 2



Pure sounds – 42 speech sounds

Letter names and sounds/ phonemes

- **Set 1:** s, a, t, p
- **Set 2:** i, n, m, d
- **Set 3:** g, o, c, k
- **Set 4:** ck, e, u, r
- **Set 5:** h, b, f, ff, l, ll, ss

Phase 3



- **Set 6:** j, v, w, x
- **Set 7:** y, z, zz, qu
- **Consonant digraphs:** ch, sh, th, ng
- **Vowel digraphs:** ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, ure, er

Phase 4



- This phase consolidates all the children have learnt in the previous phases.
- Plus constant clusters – bl, pl, sl, sp, fr, (not digraphs)

Phase 5



- Children will be taught new graphemes and alternative pronunciations for these graphemes.
- **Vowel digraphs:** wh, ph, ay, ou, ie, ea, oy, ir, ue, aw, ew, oe, au
- **Split digraphs:** a_e, e_e, i_e, o_e, u_e

Phase 6



- The focus is on learning spelling rules for suffixes.

-er -est -y -en
-ful -ly -ment -ness

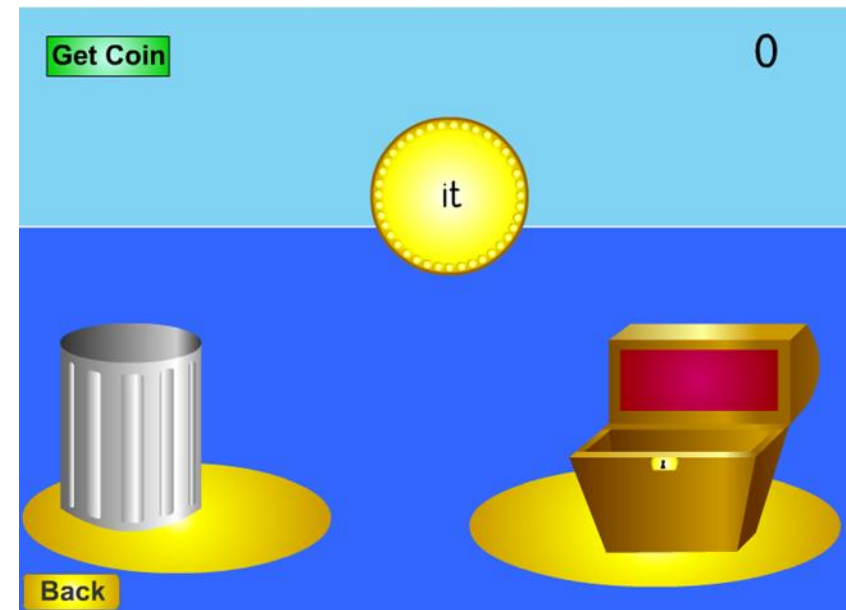
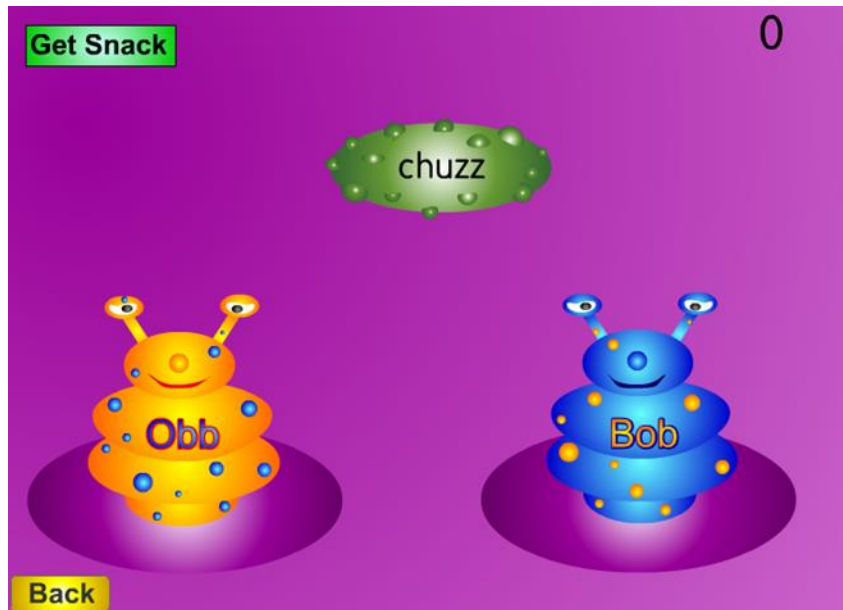
What does a Phonics lesson look like?
