Our Mission Statement

Two sites becoming one school

- Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children will be located on the current Scott Lower School site (Key Stage 1)
- *Children can arrive at school anytime between 8:35am and 8:45am when registration is taken. The school day ends at 3:15pm (Nursery and Reception children finish at 3:10pm)*
- Years 3, 4 5 and 6 children will be located on the current Beauchamp Middle School site (Key Stage 2)
- *The school gates open at 8:20am. School will start at 8:30am and finish at 3:30pm.*

Uniform

The school logo is currently being redesigned to incorporate the fact that the school will be called 'Scott Primary School'. Children who currently have the Scott Lower School uniform, which still fits them, will not need to replace their uniform until the children have grown out of it. We will still continue to wear Scott Red sweatshirts, White polo tops and have Scott book bags.

Children going into Year 5

The children in Year 5 will wear a white shirt with a Scott Primary School clip-on tie and a Red Scott V-Neck sweatshirt. The rest of the uniform will remain the same. Details of the Scott Primary School Tie and sweatshirt will be available once the logo has been confirmed.

Walking to and from school

Children in Years 5 and 6 will be able to walk to and from school by themselves as long as you have provided the school with written permission for this to happen. We encourage you to discuss the safest routes to and from school with your child. Year 5 and 6 children will not be able to take responsibility for younger children.

MyMaths

MyMaths is an interactive online teaching and homework service written by experienced teachers for all the UK National Curricula. MyMaths Provides an important consolidating link between school and home, with access so parents can review their child's progress. This will be available for children in Years 3, 4 5 and 6 from September 2017.



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ParentMail

ParentMail will be our new communication method across the whole school which will allow parents to access information via their smartphones or mobile devices. This will give parents direct access to the latest letters, newsletters, diary, bookings for parents consultation evenings and the ability to pay for school trips.

Homework Planners and equipment

Children in Years 5 and 6 will have a homework planner for the year. Children in Year 5 and 6 may bring a labelled pencil case into school containing blue handwriting pens (no gel pens or biros), HB pencils, coloured pencils, 30cm ruler, sharpener and a rubber.
