2nd September 1666 The fire starts at around 1am. 3rd September 1666 The fire gets very close to the

Tower of London

4th September 1666 St Paul's Cathedral is destroyed by the fire 5th September 1666 The wind dies down and the fire stops spreading as quickly 6th September 1666 The fire is finally put out. Thousands of people are left homeless.
