Theme Content - National Curriculum links

Foundation Subjects

English

The children will be exploring the text Dragon Post by Emma Yarlett. They will write in a range of styles, for different purposes, including a letter, lists and finally, a set of instructions for how to look after a dragon.

Maths

Calculation and Geometry

This half term we will continue to use a range of methods for addition and subtraction of numbers within 10. We will explore 2D and 3D shapes, learning their names and some simple properties. We will also learn to sort shapes according to these properties...

Science

In Science, we will be exploring, identifying and classifying a range of everyday materials and their physical properties. We will also be asking questions to support our investigations, such as 'Which material would be the best to make a boat from?'

Computing

The children will learn what data is and the different ways that it can be represented and developing an understanding of why data is useful, how it can be used and ways in which it can be gathered and recorded both by humans and computers.

Music

Through fairy tales, children are introduced to the concept of timbre; learning that different sounds can represent characters and key moments in a story.
