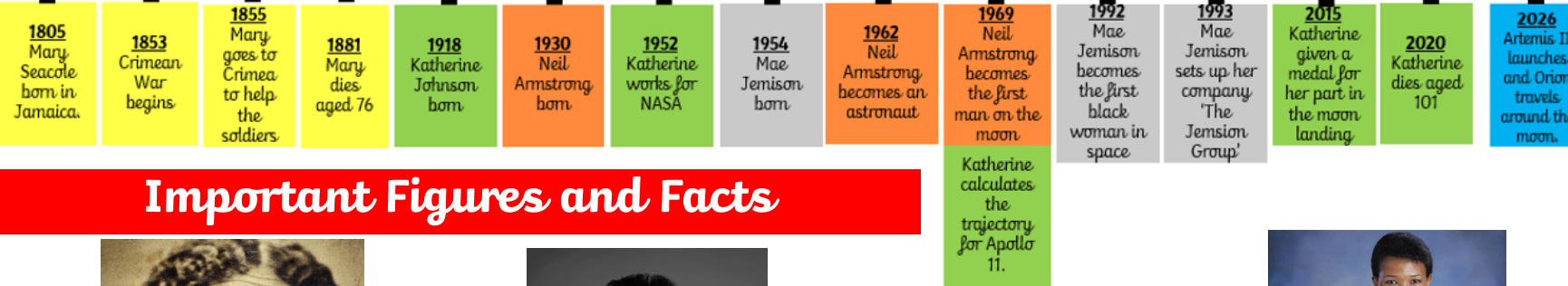

Mary Seacole

- Mary Seacole was a nurse in the past (Victorian period).
- Mary was born in Jamaica.
- Mary was treated differently because she was a 'Creole' (of mixed heritage) by Florence Nightingale and other white people.
- Mary went to the Crimean War to look after the wounded soldiers.
- Mary built The British Hotel.
- Mary died aged 76.

Katherine Johnson

- Katherine was born in America after Mary Seacole.
- She was very good at Maths.
- She was treated differently because of her skin colour.
- Katherine worked for NASA.
- Katherine solved the Maths problem to help get Neil Armstrong to the moon.

Neil Armstrong

- Neil joined NASA (1962).
- Neil became a pilot aged 16.
- Neil went to the moon in the space-flight Apollo 11.
- Neil Armstrong was the first man to walk on the moon.

Mae Jemison

- Mae Jemison is still alive today.
- Mae is a doctor and was an astronaut for NASA.
- Mae was the first black female astronaut in space.
- Mae created her own company to invent things and help people in poor countries.
