 $\hfill\square$  The Amazon Rainforest is currently 2.3 million square miles in size. Over the past 40 years it has shrunk by 20% due to deforestation. .

- □ The climate is humid tropical, which means it warm but rain falls all year round.
- □ The Amazon River is a physical feature found in the Amazon. It is the second longest river in the world. The Nile is the longest.
- □ The Amazon Rainforest is located close to the equator which is why it has a humid tropical climate.

 $\hfill\square$  The Amazon Rainforest is home to 427 mammal species, 1300 bird species, 378 species of reptiles and more than 400 species of amphibians.
