

# Grid references And symbols



- $\ \square$  A grid reference allows someone to mark a place ion a map by referring to vertical and horizontal lines called eastings and northings.
- □ You can use either a four figure grid reference or a six figure grid reference when finding places on a map.
- A good way to remember which numbers come first when writing the grid reference numbers is to go along the corridor and then up the stairs.
- Grid reference numbers always come in between brackets with a comma separating the numbers

#### England

- Bedford—Bedford is a town that is found in the county of Bedfordshire. The UK is made up of many different counties which is governed by different groups of people.
- Towns and villages are smaller than counties, but they make up the counties. There are 48 counties in England, 33 in Scotland, 22 in Wales, 26 in the Republic of Ireland and 6 in Northern Ireland.
- □ The counties of England are areas of land, cities and towns that are used for different purposes. This makes it easier fir the government to rule.
- A region is an area of land that has common features. The UK is classed as a region which comprises England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
