### **Important Facts**

- Queen Victoria reigned for 63 years from 1837 1901. Victoria dominated the period synonymous with her long reign.
- This was a period of rapid change and intense pioneering achievements usually referred to as revolutionary
- Major changes took place during this period, including industrialisation, urbanisation, growth of the railways.

• People began to realise that coal and steam could be used to power factories, large machines, flour and cotton mills.
