

Questions to ask your child when reading Year 5

| Vocabulary Questions | *What does the word/phrase/sentence tell you about the character/setting/mood? *By writingwhat effect has the author created? Do you think they intended to? *By writing in this way what effect has the author created? *What other words/phrases could the author have used here? *How has the author made you feel by writing? |
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| Retrieval Questions | *Find the in the text. Is it anywhere else? *When/where is this set? Find evidence in the text *Find the part of the story that best describes the setting *What do you think is happening here? Why? *Who is telling this story? |
| Inference Questions | *What do you thinkmeans? Why do you think that? Could it be anything else? *I thinkDo you agree? Why/why not? *Why do you think the author decided to? *Can you explain why? *What do these words mean and why do you think the author chose them? |
| Prediction Questions | *Can you think of another story with a similar theme? How do their plots differ? *Which stories have openings like this? Do you think that this story will develop in the same way? *Why did the author choose this setting? Will that influence the story? |
| Summarising Questions | *What is the main point in this paragraph? Is it mentioned anywhere else? *Sum up what has happened so far insentences *Which is the most important point in these paragraphs? *Do any sections/paragraphs deal with the same themes? |
| Compare, contrast and comment Questions | *What is similar/different about these 2 characters? Did the author intend that? *Explain whydid that. *Describe different characters' reactions to the same event *Does this story have a moral? *Which is better and why? |
| Author Questions | *What does the wordtell you about? *Find 2 ways in which the author tells you? *What do you think the author meant by? *Which words do you think are most important? Why? *Which words do you like the most? Why? *How has the author made you feel sad/happy/scared etc? |
