Our Squirrels' group made pancakes in the cookery room. The children were super excited and made some very yummy pancakes.














Before half term 41 children in Year 5 completed their artwork for the Annual Art Bytes competition.

Six works of art were awarded prizes: Three for the most votes, one was chosen by our MP Mohammad Yasin and two for technical merit by Mrs Stott.


Prizes were awarded in a special assembly attended by Mr Hayward, our Cultural Link Governor and Vice-Chair
